

SECTION 01010 – SUMMARY OF WORK

PART 1 - GENERAL

1.1 RELATED DOCUMENTS

- A. Drawings and general provisions of the Contract, including General and Supplementary Conditions and other Division 1 Specification Sections, apply to this Section.

1.2 PROJECT DESCRIPTION

- A. The project location is Stones Ranch Military Reservation, 464 Boston Post Road, East Lyme, CT 06333-1405
- B. The project consists of the vertical construction, all work above the foundation/slab, of one new latrine building at the Perry Park site located at Stones Ranch Military Reservation, East Lyme, CT. All fit-out and finish portions of the proposed new latrine shall be applied toward the completion of existing latrine, building “A”, collocated on the Perry Park site.
- C. The scope of work includes developing a Bill of Materials including the equipment required to construct the structure and the purchase of all materials. The structure is delineated on the project drawings. All fit-out and finish work, and work noted on the project drawings “FIT-OUT WORK SHOWN IS SHOWN FOR COORDINATION PURPOSES”, shall be included in the scope of work as well.
- D. The design shall be in accordance with federal, state and local laws, codes, ordinances, rules, regulations, orders and other legal requirements of public authorities that bear on performance of work; and, widely accepted industry standards, including but not limited to:
 - 1. Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA).
 - 2. Connecticut Department of Environmental Protection (DEP).

1.3 CONTRACT DRAWINGS

- A. Coordinate with the Military Department for availability of "as- built" records or other drawings of project site.
- B. All existing conditions may not be indicated on drawings. Failure to visit the site and note all conditions will in no way relieve the Contractor from completing the work.
- C. Contract Drawings: Following drawings accompany this specification and are a part thereof.

- D. Check furnished Drawings and notify the State of any discrepancies. Check dimensions on Drawings for accuracy. Determine exact dimensions for proper fit.

1.4 USE OF PREMISES

- A. General: Contractor shall have full use of premises for construction operations, including use of Project site, during construction period. Contractor's use of premises is limited only by Owner's right to perform work or to retain other contractors on portions of Project or other areas of the site.

1.5 REFERENCE SPECIFICATIONS

- A. References to the Form 814A mean the State of Connecticut Department of Transportation "Standard Specifications for Roads, Bridges and Incidental Construction, 1995" – Division II; including any interim and supplemental specifications. All construction under this contract shall adhere to these plans and specifications.
- B. In Form 814A, where the words "State of Connecticut" or "Department" appear, it shall be interpreted to mean "CTARNG" if inserted there in.

1.6 SPECIFICATION FORMATS AND CONVENTIONS

- A. Specification Format: The Specifications are organized into Divisions and Sections using the 16-division format and CSI/CSC's "MasterFormat" numbering system.
 - 1. Section Identification: The Specifications use section numbers and titles to help cross-referencing in the Contract Documents. Sections in the Project Manual are in numeric sequence; however, the sequence is incomplete. Consult the table of contents at the beginning of the Project Manual to determine numbers and names of sections in the Contract Documents.
- B. Specification Content: The Specifications use certain conventions for the style of language and the intended meaning of certain terms, words, and phrases when used in particular situations. These conventions are as follows:
 - 1. Abbreviated Language: Language used in the Specifications and other Contract Documents is abbreviated. Words and meanings shall be interpreted as appropriate. Words implied, but not stated, shall be inferred as the sense requires. Singular words shall be interpreted as plural, and plural words shall be interpreted as singular where applicable as the context of the Contract Documents indicates.
 - 2. Imperative mood and streamlined language are generally used in the Specifications. Requirements expressed in the imperative mood are to be performed by Contractor. Occasionally, the indicative or subjunctive mood may be used in the Section Text for clarity to describe responsibilities that must be fulfilled indirectly by Contractor or by others when so noted.

- a. The words "shall," "shall be," or "shall comply with," depending on the context, are implied where a colon (:) is used within a sentence or phrase.
